Verse one of this psalm expresses a sigh of gratitude from the seeker: "O Lord, you have searched me and you know me." God knows us. Do we know Him? Pleading with God to search our heart is the alternative to claiming to have a fellowship with God but, in reality, are walking in darkness.
