Si parte però dalla famiglia d'origine, ovvero da Francesco Ermete (Alfredo) Bruni di San Lorenzo del Vallo e da Giulia Gaudinieri di Spezzano Albanese. Il commercio e la nobiltà incontrano due famiglie che sono possidenti agrarie. È il mondo delle professioni che apre prospettive sia culturali che tecnico-amministrative. La nobiltà militare è stata testimoniata dal colonnello Agostino Gaudinieri, più volte decorato nella Grande Guerra, che è parte integrante tra le pagine del libro. Si parla di una famiglia, quella dei Gaudinieri-Bruni, ma si propone uno scavo meticoloso e speculare e una interpretazione nell'evoluzione delle risorse, delle economie e delle nuove forme aristocratiche nella Calabria del Nord e del Regno di Napoli. Il libro si chiude con uno studio che lega la famiglia al culto paolano, documentato, grazie alla attestazione della Platea Gaudinieri dalla quale si evince il segno tangibile della comunanza tra l'Ordine dei Minimi e i Gaudinieri in una profonda visione cristiana.
