The book demonstrates that most major forms of direct taxation during the 16th, 17th & 18th centuries contained taxation at source, & that its use increased with the passage of time. The Origins of Taxation at Source in England shows that by the time Addington introduced the income tax of 1803, the tradition of taxation at source had long been established, & that its application in the income tax was a continuation of past practice.
