The Dove Flyer tells the story of the last years of the Jewish community in Baghdad, before their expulsion in 1950 and settlement in Israel. The young narrator, Kabi, watches as the members of his extended family each develop different dreams and a different sets of fears throughout these tumultuous, transitional times: his mother wants to move out of the new Jewish quarter and back to their old Muslim neighborhood where she felt safer; his father wants to emigrate to the

promised land, the new State of Israel, where he will farm and grow rice; his uncle Hizkel, a Zionist, is arrested and taken off to prison to await trial and a possible death sentence; his headmaster, Salim, believes in the equality of Arabs and Jews; and his uncle Edouard just wants to hang out on the rooftop with his doves. Meanwhile, as World War II draws closer and Israeli statehood seems more assured, a noose begins to tighten around Jewish Iraqis. Houses are appropriated, Jews are beaten in the streets and hung in public, and young Kabi watches as the storied legacy of the Jewish community in

Baghdad is dismantled piecemeal and finally decimated. As for the land of milk and honey, there is neither milk, nor honey. It is a desert, a place as barren and coarse as the community Kabi and his family left behind was vibrant, bountiful, and dreamy.

Daddy's Wings - Milena Agus 2011

In Milena Agus' radiant Sardinia, Madame owns a piece of land by the sea which property developers are after. But Madame doesn't want to sell and therefore prevents her neighbours and other locals from cashing in. Even so, they can't help loving her for her generous and candid way

of being. A fourteen year old girl tells the story through an imagination that shapes reality: her missing father appears in the slight movements of the air (Daddy's wings), and sharp scenes of hardcore sex seem to take place in Madame's house at night. It is a comic and truculent story, fairytale-like and true – as are all Milena Agus' works. Most of all, it is the story of love affairs that go somewhat awry but still manage to go on, which is the most important thing.

Valses Poeticos - Enrique Granados 2011-09-11
There has long been a recognition of the adaptability of Granados' selected piano music to the guitar, starting with the great arrangements of La Maja de Goya and Dedicatoria by Granados' younger contemporary Miguel Llobet (1878-1938)

and continuing through the 20th century with numerous arrangers' adaptations of the Doce danzas españolas. There may be some validity to the common notion that the success of these adaptations has to do with the essential "Spanish" character in the music manifesting so naturally on the guitar, the essential Spanish instrument. Of course, the guitar has a strong presence in Spanish culture but it can just as readily claim France or Italy as a homeland. Moreover and more particularly, it is the delicacy of texture in the writing that makes adaptation possible and successful. The original score of Valses Poéticos

does not prescribe a transcendental pianism, or put the range and voicing capacities of the piano at the centre of the musical oration. The elegant reserve of the writing, along with some good luck, makes idiomatic arrangement possible and even allows for maintaining the original keys and key architecture in the present arrangement.
