Der Einfluss der Gospelmusik auf den Jazz zwischen 1950 und 1970 - Micha Keding 2005-08-18

Inhaltsangabe: Einleitung: In seinem „Jazzbuch“ schreibt Joachim Ernst Behrendt: „Musiker wie Milt Jackson, Horace Silver, Ray Charles haben in der zweiten Hälfte der fünfziger Jahre eine Soul-Welle ausgelöst, die ihre entscheidenden Impulse aus der Gospelmusik bezog...“ Als begeisterter GossPELLIEBHABER und Chorleiter regte mich diese Aussage an, konkret nach diesen Impulsen zu fragen. Es interessierte mich, welche Elemente die Komponisten und Solisten aus der Gospelmusik übernahmen und in ihr Spiel integrierten. Bei der Untersuchung musste ich wegen der Vielzahl der Musikstile die Bereiche des Jazz eingrenzen. Ich beschränke mich auf die Musiker des sogenannten „Hardbop“, da hier der Einfluss der Gospelmusik am stärksten spürbar war. Von diesen Musikern ging im Wesentlichen die von Behrendt

genannte Soul-Welle aus, die danach viele Musiker beeinflusste. Zunächst beschreibe ich geschichtlich die Entstehung der Gospelmusik und stelle ihre musikalischen Merkmale ausführlich dar. Zur Verdeutlichung habe ich jeweils Hörbeispiele angefügt. Anschließend gehe ich drei prägende Werke des Hardbop chronologisch durch, in denen der Einfluss der Gospelmusik zum Tragen kommt: - „The Preacher“ von Horace Silver. - „Moanin'“ von Bobby Timmons. - „This Here“ von Cannonball Adderley. Die „Transkriptionen“ stammen von den Aufnahmen der ersten Erscheinungen der Stücke. Die Analysen der Kompositionen und Soli sollen die Elemente repräsentativ herausstellen, die von der Gospelmusik in den Jazz übernommen worden sind. Die Jazzmusiker, die für diese Stücke als Komponisten oder Interpreten stehen, sollen kurz vorgestellt und nach ihrer Beziehung zur Gospelmusik befragt werden. Weiterhin werden andere Musiker dieser Zeit im Hinblick auf das vorliegende Thema beleuchtet. Der bedeutendste Stil im Jazz der 40er Jahre war der Bebop. Anfang der 50er Jahre folgte eine Weiterführung aller Errungenschaften des Bebop in mehrere Richtungen. Zum Einen wurde die Rhythmik intensiviert, woraus sich Konzepte entwickelten, die in ungeraden Taktarten und polymetrischen Rhythmen z.B. von Max Roach, Art Blakey, Dexter Gordon u.a. realisiert wurden. Ebenso entwickelten sich improvisatorische und harmonische Weiterführungen der im Bebop gebräuchlichen Harmonik. Komponisten ließen auch Stilelemente aus afrikanischen, afrokubanischen oder brasilianischen Kulturen in den Jazz einfließen. Zum anderen waren da Musiker wie Lennie Tristano, Lee Konitz, Miles Davis u.a., die nach der [...]

In *The Contradictions of Jazz*, Paul Rinzler takes a new approach to jazz aesthetics and theory by exploring four pairs of opposites present in jazz: individualism and interconnectedness, assertion and openness, freedom and responsibility, and creativity and tradition. By themselves, these eight values speak volumes about the meaning of jazz and its significance. philosophies of phenomenology and existentialism. Rinzler considers the opposites inherent in the product and process of jazz, as well as mistakes and the challenge of perfection, presenting these values in light of the contradictions inherent in jazz. With a full bibliography and an index, *The Contradictions of Jazz* is a fascinating read for fans and scholars of jazz history and aesthetics.

This work puts together in one volume all the book and scholarly materials related to jazz lives and organizes them in such a way that the reader, at a glance, can see the entire sweep

of writings on a given artist and grasp the nature of their contents. The bibliography includes many different kinds of biographical source material published in all languages from 1921 to the present, such as biographies, autobiographies, interview collections, musical treatises, bio-discographies, anthologies of newspaper articles, Master theses, and Ph.D. dissertations. With few exceptions, a work of at least 50 pages in length merits inclusion, providing it has a substantive biographical component or aids jazz research. The main section of the work is an alphabetical listing of sources on individual jazz artists and ensembles. Jazz artists, as defined by Carner, are those who have made their mark as jazz performers and who have led the jazz life, playing the clubs and joints, not the legitimate concert stage, Broadway, Las Vegas, or the like. Thus, musicians such as Ray Charles or Frank Sinatra, who have recorded and performed with jazz ensembles, do not qualify for inclusion. Each bonafide jazz musician is given a separate section with birth, death, and primary instrumentation provided. Biographical sources about the artist or ensemble follow. Each entry is annotated to differentiate it from another and to present basic data on the source's content, such as the inclusion of a discography, bibliography, music examples and transcriptions, footnotes, indexes, illustrations, filmographies, and glossaries. An invaluable tool for jazz researchers and historians, Jazz Performers will also appeal to jazz enthusiasts in general.

Free Jazz/Black Power - Philippe Carles

In 1971, French jazz critics Philippe Carles and Jean-Louis Comolli co-wrote Free Jazz/Black Power, a treatise on the racial and political implications of jazz and jazz criticism. It remains a testimony to the long ignored encounter of radical African American music and French left-wing criticism. Carles and Comolli set out to defend a genre vilified by jazz critics on both sides of the Atlantic by exposing the new sound's ties to African American culture, history, and the political struggle that was raging in the early 1970s. The two offered a political and cultural history of black presence in the United States to shed more light on the dubious role played by jazz criticism in racial oppression. This analysis of jazz criticism and its production is astutely self-aware. It critiques the

critics, building a work of cultural studies in a time and place where the practice was virtually unknown. The authors reached radical conclusions—free jazz was a revolutionary reaction against white domination, was the musical counterpart to the Black Power movement, and was a music that demanded a similar political commitment. The impact of this book is difficult to overstate, as it made readers reconsider their response to African American music. In some cases it changed the way musicians thought about and played jazz. Free Jazz / Black Power remains indispensable to the study of the relation of American free jazz to European audiences, critics, and artists. This monumental critique caught the spirit of its time and also realigned that zeitgeist.

The Shadow and Its Shadow - Paul Hammond 2000-11

The Shadow and Its Shadow is a classic collection of writings by the Surrealists on their mad love of moviegoing. The forty-odd theoretical, polemical, and poetical re-visions of the seventh art in this anthology document Surrealism's scandalous and nonreductive take on film. Writing between 1918 and 1977, the essayists include such names as André Breton, Louis Aragon, Robert Desnos, Salvador Dalí, Luis Buñuel, and man Ray, as well as many of the less famous though equally fascinating figures of the movement. Paul Hammond's introduction limns the history of Surrealist cinemania, highlighting how these revolutionary poets, artists, and philosophers sifted the silt of commercial-often Hollywood-cinema for the odd fleck of gold, the windfall movie that, somehow slipping past the censor, questioned the dominant order. Such prospecting pivoted around the notion of lyrical behavior-as depicted on the screen and as lived in the movie house. The representation of such behavior led the Surrealists to valorize the manifest content of such denigrated genres as silent and sound comedy, romantic melodrama, film noir, horror movies. As to lived experience, moviegoing Surrealists looked to the spectacle's latent meaning, reading films as the unwitting providers of redemptive sequences that could be mentally clipped out of their narrative context and inserted into daily life-there, to provoke new adventures.
