In this regard, questions of divergence and convergence become highly salient. The book makes the complexity of spatial and social developments in Germany comprehensible. Beginning with an overview of the physical structures of Germany which provides the material point of departure for the societal development of Germany, key aspects of the German history are discussed. The complexity of spatial processes in Germany is illustrated in case study regions dealing with the challenges of structural change in traditional industrial regions (such as the Ruhr area), or e.g. efforts of Berlin to position and find itself as the capital of a unified Germany. Overall, the book shows how theory-driven regional geographic research can make spatiotemporal complexities tangible and comprehensible.

Dabei wird unter anderem der Frage nachgegangen, welche Veränderungen und Gefahren mit der Digitalisierung einhergehen. In einem dritten Teil wird der Handlungsrahmen sowie die Handlungsmöglichkeiten für die öffentliche Verwaltung abgesteckt. In diesem Zusammenhang werden die rechtlichen Rahmenbedingungen und Zertifizierungsmöglichkeiten (IT-Sicherheitsgesetz, BSI-Grundschutz usw.), Präventionsmaßnahmen sowie Beispiele im Sinne von Best Practice (Kommunale IT-Sicherheitsstrategien) betrachtet. In dem abschließenden vierten Teil wird mit den Themen Blockchain-Technologie und Cybercrime-Versicherung ein Ausblick auf Innovationen zur Begegnung von Cyberangriffen gegeben. Das Handbuch sensibilisiert einerseits für die Gefahren und Risiken von Cyberangriffen und zeigt andererseits Handlungsmöglichkeiten auf, diesen zu begegnen. Dabei ist es an einen breiten Personenkreis aus der öffentlichen Verwaltung adressiert.

**Planning for Coastal Resilience** - Timothy Beatley 2012-06-22

Climate change is predicted to increase the frequency and magnitude of coastal storms around the globe, and the anticipated rise of sea levels will have enormous impact on fragile and vulnerable coastal regions. In the U.S., more than 50% of the population inhabits coastal areas. In *Planning for Coastal Resilience*, Tim Beatley argues that, in the face of such threats, all future coastal planning and management must reflect a commitment to the concept of resilience. In this timely book, he writes that coastal resilience must become the primary design and planning principle to guide all future development and all future infrastructure decisions. Resilience, Beatley explains, is a profoundly new way of viewing coastal infrastructure—an approach that values smaller, decentralized kinds of energy, water, and transport more suited to the serious physical conditions coastal communities will likely face. Implicit in the notion is an emphasis on taking steps to build adaptive capacity, to be ready ahead of a crisis or disaster. It is anticipatory, conscious, and intentional in its outlook. After defining and explaining coastal resilience, Beatley focuses on what it means in practice. Resilience goes beyond reactive steps to prevent or handle a disaster. It takes a holistic approach to what makes a community resilient, including such factors as social capital and sense of place. Beatley provides case studies of five U.S. coastal communities, and “resilience profiles” of six North American communities, to suggest best practices and to propose guidelines for increasing resilience in threatened communities.
